- AWPHD offers tailored education to publicly elected officials focused on the unique challenges, regulations and high-functioning governance it takes to run a Public Hospital District (PHD). - RCW 70.44.050 requires that the board's business be conducted by resolution or motion. This provision also requires that resolutions be adopted by most of the entire board of commissioners. AWPHD, with the help of <u>Municipal Research</u> <u>Services Center</u> (MRSC) has compiled a list of required resolutions. Please note this list may not be complete and we will work on updating it as other statutory mandates become known.

Attorney General Office:

- All public hospital district commissioners must, within 90 days after taking the oath
 of office, receive training on the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act
 (OPMA) and Public Records Act (PRA). Please see below an option to fulfill this
 requirement by taking the training through the Attorney General's office.
